Agents Of Change: the **Problematic Landscape Of** Pakistan's K-12 Education and the People Leading the Change

On February 22, 2022, AERC hosted a discussion on the book Agents of Change: The Problematic Landscape of Pakistan's K-12 Education and the People Leading the Change. Co-author Nadeem Hussain engaged with graduate students and faculty, emphasizing the necessity of equitable education and the role of civic participation in educational reforms. The event underscored the book's exploration of Pakistan's diverse educational systems and the disparities therein, advocating for quality education as a fundamental human right.









On September 28, 2023, AERC hosted a book launch event where three significant publications were unveiled, each addressing critical contemporary issues. The event brought together academics, researchers, and students to discuss innovative solutions, social impacts, and governance challenges.

Pakistan's Energy Crisis is Impacting **Quality of Life**

Experts highlighted the severe impact of overbilling by Independent Power Producers (IPPs) on households and businesses, emphasizing the need for renegotiating contracts, ensuring transparency, implementing energy sector reforms to make electricity more affordable and reliable.



Charter of Economy

The "Charter of Economy" proposed by Dr. Qaiser Bengali, a prominent economist, is part of his broader recommendations to address Pakistan's economic challenges. He emphasizes the need for structural reforms to promote industrial growth, reduce government spending, and ensure fiscal discipline.
